

Key Points:

- Council Tax Band Challenges Expected to Rise: As homeowners receive their bills, an increase in challenges is anticipated in the coming months.
- Types of Challenges:
 - Proposals Homeowners can submit a formal proposal if they have been paying Council Tax for less than six months, if the VOA has changed their band in the last six months, or if there have been physical changes in the local area. The VOA is legally required to review proposals.
 - Band Reviews Those who have paid Council Tax for over six months and believe
 their band is incorrect can request an informal review. While not legally required, the
 VOA considers reviews where strong evidence supports a change.
- **Checking Your Band:** Homeowners can verify their Council Tax bands on GOV.UK and compare them with similar properties in the neighborhood.
- Providing Evidence: Challenges require supporting evidence, including comparable property details based on location, type, age, and size. For England, property sales between April 1, 1989 March 31, 1993 are considered valid evidence, while for Wales, the period is April 1, 2001 March 31, 2003.
- Submission Process: Challenges can be submitted online, via email, or by post.
- **Potential Outcomes:** A property's band may increase, decrease, or remain unchanged. If a band adjustment is made, neighboring properties might also be reviewed.
- Council Tax Payment Obligations: While awaiting a decision, homeowners must continue paying their bills to avoid penalties or legal action.

As the VOA handles a high volume of inquiries during this period, **priority is given to legal challenges** (proposals) over informal band reviews. More details and official guidance can be found on **GOV.UK.**
